Update from the Year Teams

Year 3

We can't believe we are coming to the end of the children's first half term at Manor Junior School. We have been extremely busy in Year 3 and so much learning has been taking place. In English, next week, inspired by the beautiful pop-up, lift-the-flap book 'Inside The Villains; by Clotilde Perrin, we will be writing an information text about a giant. This week we have been working hard to improve our sentences and vocabulary choices and explaining the layout of information texts. Our maths learning has focused on solving problems involving money and length. We discovered we had to read the problems carefully! We have learnt what perimeter is and how to measure the perimeter of polygons.

The children have produced some outstanding pieces of art work based on the incredible work of Frank Bowling. In dance, working with partners and small groups, we have learnt about British folk dance which has included exploring appropriate actions and spatial patterns before memorising and performing short movement sequences. We have loved using the musical instruments to compose and perform a piece of music based on Kerry Andrew's, 'No Place Like' song.

This week as part of our geography learning we have enjoyed a walk along Cove Brook to Giffard Drive Shops. During the walk we observed the human and physical features of the local area and completed a sketch map. We also identified different types of land use. Once we returned to class we explored and discussed our findings.

As you know home learning projects were due in this week and we have started to share these in our year group assembly. It has been wonderful to share all the fabulous learning that has been completed.

We are all looking forward to seeing parents and carers at our Year 3 celebration of learning after school on Thursday 24th October in the Year 3 classrooms where you will have the opportunity to see some of the children's fantastic learning from our 'UK Manor and Me' topic. We hope you can join us.

Year 4

Once again, we have been really proud of Year 4 this week for pushing themselves out of their comfort zones! They have been auditioning for our Christmas production (Lights, Camel, Action!) and it has been such as joy to see them standing up to read in front of an audience despite being quite nervous in many cases. We will be assigning roles and giving out scripts before the half term break so that children can start to learn their lines over the holidays – rehearsals will start in earnest when we get back in November.

Year 4 have been learning about money and measure in maths. This would be a great topic to apply in context at home, whether while doing your weekly shop or looking at the distance you are travelling on a car journey. See if they can add money amounts, find change and convert between metres and kilometres to recap what they have been learning at school.

On that note, we really appreciate the effort that continues to be made at home to support children with their learning. We have been blown away by the fantastic homework projects that children have shared this week! It is also fantastic to see how daily reading at home and practising on TT Rockstars is really increasing children's confidence and attainment in class. Keep up the good work!

We look forward to seeing you next Thursday (24th October) between 9.00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. in the school hall to celebrate some of the fantastic work that Year 4 have done this term.

Year 5

A BIG thank you to everyone who brought in their half term homework to share with the year group it was fantastic to see all of the amazing art work and power points that they have produced. Well done to 5D who won the times table rockstar competition with Tinashe, Maxine and Leo taking the top spots.

In English, year 5 have been enjoying Kensuke's Kingdom in both our reading and writing. They have been discussing the different emotions that Michael would feel throughout the story and writing conversations between Michael and Kensuke.

In maths, we have just finished our division and multiplication unit where we have been learning about prime numbers and factors. Any extra support you can give to help your child to learn their times tables will really help them.

Last Tuesday Year 5 went to the Winchester Science Museum. During the day we went to the planetarium, saw a space science show and tried all of the exhibits. It was a pleasure to take Year 5 to the science museum, they were a credit to the school.
